

# Prof. Wolfgang Kurz

Conductor. Composer

Wolfgang Kurz, born 1954, studied conducting with Prof. Jan Koetsier and Prof. Hermann Michael at the Academy of Music in Munich as well as in classes with Sergiu Celibidache. In addition, he received a Bachelor of Philosophy at the Academy of Philosophy in Munich.

He started his musical career at the Bavarian State Opera in Munich as a coach and musical assistant of the General Music

Director (highest ranking conductor at the Bavarian State Opera) Wolfgang Sawallisch. After six years as a conductor at the Hessen State Theater in Wiesbaden from 1980 to 1986 he was engaged at the Würzburg Theater. Since 1988 Wolfgang Kurz has been lecturer of conducting at the Würzburg Music Academy. In addition, he was a teacher in the Frankfurt/Main Music Academy from 1992 to 1993. Wolfgang Kurz received several invitations as a visiting Professor for conducting through the European ERASMUS (European Community Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students) Programme which included giving masterclasses in Porto (Portugal), Salamanca (Spain), and Monopoli (Italy).

Beside his many duties as guest conductor of various orchestras, he also performs as a Lied accompanist.

Wolfgang Kurz is a guest conductor at: Ensemble Insieme (Seoul, South Korea), Incheon Opera Company, Bach-Collegium Munich, the Baden-Baden Philharmonic Orchestra, Vogtland Philharmonic Orchestra, Kurpfalz Chamber Orchestra of Mannheim, Nürnberg Symphony, Salieri Chamber Orchestra (Hungary), Bavarian Chamber Opera in Veitshöchheim, Symphony Orchestra of the University of Technology Darmstadt, Ansbach Chamber Orchestra, Sinfonia Mozartiana, Chamber Orchestra of Bad Mergentheim, and the Allgäu Sinfonietta (Concert Tour in South Korea) among others.

His activities as a composer include compositions and arrangements for choir and orchestra. In 1999, he was a prize winner at the Valentin-Becker-Competition for Choral Music. In 2002, he was triple prize winner at the Competition for Choral Music of the Hessen Choral Union.
